Dear Senator Levin:

It has been four months since you received my letter of 11 January 2008. I have telephoned your office twice. On the first call I was informed that response involves a "minimum of 40 days." That was news to me, and I have been writing to you since moving to Michigan in 1981. On the second telephone call to your office I was placed on hold, etc.

My specific concern involves protecting and upholding of the integrity of the United States Constitution. It is not a trivial or superficial concern. Again, it was in this context, among others, that I wrote to Chief Justice John Roberts on April 2 2007 and asked a simple, polite question:
